

## LOUIS WINDMULLER'S WILL.

**Estate Goes to Children with Gifts  
to Old Servants.**

The will of Louis Windmuller was filed for probate in the office of Surrogate Daniel Noble at Jamaica, L. I., yesterday afternoon. He died on Oct. 1 at his home in Woodside, L. I., just after his son had been appointed a committee to take charge of his property.

The will was executed on Nov. 29, 1899, and the Title Guarantee and Trust Company is appointed executor. The estate is valued at "over \$10,000 in personal property." His home is mentioned in the will as having been given to his wife. The testator owned no realty. An oil painting, known as "The Fistic Duel," is given to the Metropolitan Museum of Art, and an oil portrait of the testator to the New York City Chamber of Commerce. The will contains the following bequests:

To Hannah Eliza Windmuller, widow, \$1,000 and other property; to Clara L. Heynen, daughter, \$1,000; to the Legal Aid Society, \$500; to the Charity Fund, New York Chamber of Commerce, \$500; to the Isabella Heimath, \$500; to the Arion Society, \$500; to the New York Press Club, \$500; to Emilia Virginia Roelker, sister of the widow, \$500; to Thomas Killilea, servant, \$500; "to my clerk," Henry Bleidoin, \$500; "to my whilom teacher," Gertrude R. Hurlbut, \$500; "to my clerk," William Gillespie, \$500; "and to every other person who up to the time of my death shall have been in the employ of my firm for five consecutive years, and whom my son, Adolph, shall certify to have faithfully performed his duty," \$100 each. The testator further provides that \$100 shall be paid to each person employed in the household who shall be duly certified by his son, Adolph, as having faithfully performed his duty. To the son, Adolph, is left his father's interest in his business, the value of which is not known.

The will provides that all the paintings and books be sold, and recommends that this be done at public auction. The Title Guarantee and Trust Company, a son, Adolph, and a brother-in-law, Hugo B. Roelker, are appointed trustees. To them is left as trustees one undivided third part of all the rest and residue of the estate. The income from this trust fund is to be paid to the widow from time to time during her life. The balance of the estate goes to the Windmuller children.
