## MISS WINDMULLER BURNED TO DEATH

Daughter of the Merchant Set Ablaze in the Kitchen of Her Father's Home.

Miss May Windmüller, daughter of Louis Windmüller, Treasurer of the Title Guarantee and Trust Company, died at 3 o'clock last night at the Windmüller residence, on Woodside Heights, Queens, from burns sustained during the afternoon.

Miss Windmüller was in the kitchen of her home, when her dress caught on the range and took fire. The dress was of light material, and almost instantly she was wrapped from head to foot in flames. She ran out into the hallway, screaming from pain.

Mr. Windmüller was in the library reading when he heard his daughter's cries. He hurried into the hallway, where he found her terribly burned and attempting to beat out the flames with her hands.

He picked up a Persian rug from the floor and wrapped it around her, extingushing the flames in this way. After he did so it was found that her clothing had been almost entirely burned away. Miss Windmüller's face was scorched, but her hair, which was done up tightly about her head, was not even touched. The worst burns were about the body.

Dr. Franklin H. Booth, who was summoned to the Windmüller residence, took all possible measures to save her life.
