THE QUININE FACTORY AT MANNHEIM. Mr. Windmüller, of the firm of Louis Windmiller & Roelker, the New-York agents for the Boehringer quinine factory at Mannheim, Germany, stated vesterday that he did not believe the report that Powers & Weightman had leased that factory. "The Mannheim factory." said Mr. Windmüller, "is owned and operated by C. F. Boehringer & Co., and Mr. Alexander Boehringer has nothing to do with it. The last named gentleman is the Director of a stock company which owns the large factory at Milan, Italy. I doubt very much if any such thing as the leasing of the Mannheim factory has ever been contemplated. The truth is, as I understand it, that Powers & Weightman intend to ally themselves closely with the Milan company, and it is their purpose to manufacture their own brand of quinine in Milan for the foreign market. I understand that Powers & Weightman have sufficient facilities here to

trade."
